Clos de los Siete Facts

- Clos de los Siete, affectionately known as C7, is made by world-renowned Bordeaux winemaker, Michel Rolland. A master blender who has consulted on hundreds of other wine brands around the world, Michel brings his blending genius to the Uco Valley in Argentina for Clos de los Siete.
- On a trip to Argentina, Michel discovered a plot of land at the foot of the Andes Mountains in the Uco Valley. Intrigued by its unique combination of high altitude, well-drained soils, dry climate and optimal aspect, Michel was certain this land would be ideal for growing a variety of Bordeaux grapes, particularly Malbec. A few years later, Michel returned to Argentina with six friends to purchase the plot and create Clos de los Siete, the vineyard of seven.
- This Malbec-driven blend is a combination of Malbec, Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, Syrah, Cabernet Franc and Petit Verdot with the proportions of each changing every vintage.
- Five key elements make this region of the Uco Valley unique:
 - **Altitude:** Vines grow at an altitude of 3,800 feet with wide variation between temperatures during the day and at night, which helps produce high quality tannins and concentrated color
 - **Water:** The proximity to the Andes means that vines are irrigated using the finest glacial melt water
 - **※ Soil:** Well draining, scarcely fertile soil stresses the vines and produces premium quality grapes
 - **Climate:** Due to the mountains, there is almost no humidity, protecting the berries from many diseases
 - **Sunlight:** High UV exposure generates thicker skinned berries leading to more skin tannins
