- The Crossings is named after the place where early European settlers first crossed the fast flowing Awatere River
- The Awatere Valley is cooler, windier, and drier than Marlborough's Wairau Valley, with generally more extreme climate conditions
 - This develops more intense aromatics, concentrated but balanced fruit flavors, and crisper acids
- The Crossings is 100% sustainable and an accredited member of Sustainable Winegrowing of New Zealand
- The Crossings is produced from three estate vineyards, each contributing different characteristics to the wine
 - ✗ Medway (est. 1996), Brackenfield (est. 1998), and Willow Flat (est. 2001)
- Two wines are produced Sauvignon Blanc which is offered in 750ml and 375ml sizes, and Pinot Noir offered in 750ml
